

Accessing PSAT Scores

December 2020

PSAT Score Reports

On December 8th, your PSAT scores will become available on your **CollegeBoard account**.

If you provided an email when you took the PSATs, you will get an email from the CollegeBoard letting you know your scores are available. Log into your account and you will see your scores.

If you don't remember your username or password, follow the retrieval instructions.

How to See your PSAT Score Report

If you have previously created a CollegeBoard account, log in to see your scores.

If you do not see your scores, you may have more than one account or the information didn't match on your account and what you put on the test. You will need to call the CollegeBoard to combine any additional accounts or match your account.

Call CollegeBoard Customer Service at **866-433-7728**

If you don't yet have a CollegeBoard Account:

If you have never created an account, create a CollegeBoard account and make sure to use the email that you provided when you took the PSATs. The CollegeBoard will recognize your email and other personal information and your PSAT score report will be on your new account.

Make sure to write down your username and password!

If you didn't list an email when you took the PSATs...

If you did not provide an email when you took the PSATs, create an account on CollegeBoard and be sure to provide the exact same information you used when you took the PSAT

(Example: if your name is Rob Pattison, but you bubbled in Robert Pattison when you took your PSATs, use the same exact identifying information to create your College Board account).

Trouble Shooting

If student scores have already been released (including previous years) and the student is having trouble accessing released scores:

- The student may need to update his/her account information. Log in to the [student score portal](#) and follow the instructions in the [Matching Tool](#) to verify information. To make corrections, click 'Update'.
- If a student is still having trouble, the school can provide the student his/her access code for PSAT-related assessments (Registration Number for the SAT or Subject Tests). The student will go to the [Matching Tool](#) and click 'Get My Scores' to enter his/her test information. If the student provided his/her student ID on the assessment, this will also work.
- Ask if the student has another College Board account that either the student or parent could have created. The student could try logging in to the other account.
- If the steps above do not work, the student needs to call customer service at **866-433-7728**

Test Booklet

The school has your booklet.

Khan Academy

The CollegeBoard only share official test information with Khan Academy. You can link your PSAT scores to Khan Academy for individualized practice. To link accounts, create/sign in to your Khan Academy account and follow instructions to sign into your CollegeBoard account and link them.

Data on increase in SATs with Khan Academy Prep

No practice: 60 Points

6-8 hours of Official SAT Prep: 90 points

20-22 hours: 115 points.

16,000 students who linked their scores with Khan Academy saw increases of 200 points.

These increases were across all demographics.

SAT

The NH State SAT will be in March, 2021. All juniors will be required to take it and will be signed up through the school and state.

Test Optional? Even before the pandemic, many colleges were choosing to become test optional.

For this current year, most colleges have been test optional.

What will happen next year? Some may return to requiring a standardized test score, many were either test optional before or were planning to go that direction.
