Title 1 at Winnacunnet

Title 1 funding provides for small classes, computers, and money for books and other print material.

Students are eligible for the Learning Center based on their reading and math scores, teacher recommendations, and grades. We contact the eighth grade staff in the four towns of the district for student recommendations for Title 1. All homeless and migrant students are eligible to participate in the program.

Students can be eligible for Title 1 services in all grades and for various classes:

- The Learning Center in F111 is open to students in study hall assigned by a counselor.
- We have a full computer lab
- One credit can be earned per trimester towards graduation

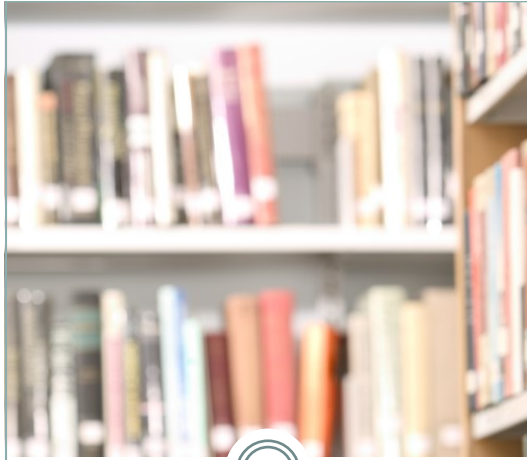
