Check for **any** new or unexplained* symptom(s)

- **Fever (100F)** or chills

* If student has a documented chronic condition that accounts for symptoms, they are not considered "new/unexplained."

When to Return to School

After testing negative for COVID-19

- 24h fever-free
- Symptoms have improved

Without COVID-19 testing

- 10 days after symptom onset
- 24h fever-free
- Symptoms have improved

After testing positive for COVID-19

- 5 days after symptom onset
- 24h fever-free and symptoms have improved
- Provide negative antigen test on day 5
- Must reliably wear a well-fitting face mask on days 6-10

Continue to isolate for 10 days if:

- Fever or symptoms persist past day 5
- Antigen test on day 5 is positive
- Unable or unwilling to wear a face mask on days 6-10

If exposed to COVID-19 in your household

Up to date on COVID-19 vaccinations OR COVID-19 positive in the past 90 days	Not vaccinated OR not up to date on COVID-19 vaccinations (incl. booster)
 Attend school Get tested for COVID-19 on day 5 Wear a mask on days 6-10 Isolate and test for any unexplained symptoms 	 Quarantine for 5 days after the last exposure Get tested for COVID-19 on day 5 Wear a well-fitting face mask on days 6-10 Isolate and test for any unexplained symptoms
